RE: Fiji National Provident Fund paid advertisements in Fiji Times 16/7/11 (page 14) and Fiji Sun 16/7/11 (page 65)

As a pensioner/beneficiary of the Fiji National Provident Fund (FNPF) I was very disturbed to read the two full page paid advertisements appearing in both the Fiji Times and Fiji Sun of Saturday 16/7/11 (pages 14 and 65 respectively) titled 'FNPF CLARIFIES PENSION REFORM'.

I was disturbed because of the cortents of paragraph 2 of the advertisement about 'self-interested individuals', and also because of FNFF's answer provided to its own 'question 2' in the separate column at the bottom of the page, that though deferred until September, the 'implementation' of the review will take place. Most of all, I am upset with the implication that I have 'outlived' my pension and the statement in paragraph 4 that we have fully utilized our pensionable sum in a far shorter period than our 'life expectancy'. This is painful to hear.

This question of FNPF proposed reform is currently before the High Court and yet the FNPF Board (which is not a properly composed Board judging from section 3 of the FNPF Act) is spending large amounts of beneficiaries' money paying for such advertisements. Such advertisements may be *subjudice*. In addition, in paragraph 3 of the advertisement, FNPF states 'these two critical reforms will proceed as planned'. Again this statement interferes with the Court processes. Moreover, the beneficiaries' permission was not taken for the so-called Board to spend our funds in this way against us, especially when it makes public statements that we have 'outlived our pensions'.

I respectfully request that, pursuant to your powers in <u>Cap 47 of the Laws of Fiji</u>, and your inherent power, Your Excellercy appoint an **independent Judicial Commission of Inquiry** into the FNPF as a whole (past, present and future), similar to the appointment of Lord Hutton of Furness in the United Kingdom in 2010/2011.
